Matching- Weekly DAA

Each weekly round starts on Monday and follows this cadence:

- Monday: Weekly Deferred Acceptance Algorithm (DAA) (a technology standard to matching solutions) run
- Monday: Matches are sent to providers
- Monday Wednesday: Three-day provider review period
- Friday: Matches are sent to families
- Friday Thursday: Family review and acceptance period





Walk-in Enrollment Process

- Provider supports the family who walked in to complete Universal Preschool application
- Provider informs LCO of placement
- LCO "Accepts" match on behalf of the family
- LCO notifies provider
- Provider completes the enrollment form

The provider must ensure there are enough seats available to serve walk-in students based on children in the matching queue in Universal Preschool Application Portal.

Providers are not required to accept walk-in enrollment. This is available for providers who have the capacity and would like to take advantage of this updated process.





Programs & Tuition

- Part-time is 10 hours/week
- Half day (AM or PM) is 15 hours/week
- Full day is 30 hours/week
- The hours awarded for Universal Preschool must be fully covered by Universal Preschool funding and providers cannot charge families additional tuition for these hours
- Providers are required to post their tuition rates





When can providers charge tuition?

Example 1

- Child attends 15 hours/week
- Child is awarded standard 15 hours/week of Universal Preschool
- Provider can not charge tuition

Example 2

- Child attends 20 hours/week
- Child is awarded standard 15 hours/week of Universal Preschool
- Provider can charge tuition (or use other funding sources) for hours 16-20 based on the providers' published rate









- Providers will be paid monthly based on the number of four-year-olds enrolled in a program by the 15th of the prior month.
- Next four-year-old payment November 8th
 - Based on enrolled children as of October 15th. Providers will no longer be paid on accepted status.
 - \circ October is the last month of late enrollment for a $\frac{1}{2}$ month rate. Students enrolled between October 15th-25th will receive a $\frac{1}{2}$ month rate payment per child in the December payment.

- Most four-year-olds will receive up to 15 hours per week of Universal Preschool
- Children with an IEP will receive funding in alignment with the number of hours in their IEP
- Children are eligible for 30 hours per week of Universal Preschool if they are in a lower income household <u>and</u> meet at least one other <u>qualifying</u> factor.
- A qualifying child will only receive the additional hours of funding if they are enrolled in a program that is at least 30 hours per week.

UPK Program	Standard Rate	Additional Hours Rate (children who meet low income + one other factor)
Part-Time (10-14 hours/wk)	10 hours	Does not apply
Half Day AM or PM (15-29 hours/wk)	15 hours	Does not apply
Full Day (30-40 hours/wk)	15 hours	30 hours
Extended Day (over 40 hours/wk)	15 hours	30 hours



*Additional hours will continue to be awarded monthly to children who are low-income +1 other qualifying factor, pending available funding





Three-year-olds

Application and Eligibility

- Must have at least one <u>qualifying factor</u> to be eligible for Universal Preschool
- Apply directly to the school district in the application portal
- Districts may serve directly, or contract with a community-based provider

Payment

- School districts will attest to the Historical Allotment
 - Attestation is due 10/31 to the vendor
 - Confirm numbers and ages served (based on local school district kindergarten start dates)
 - Confirm any pass-through funds to community partners for preschool services
- Payments will be distributed as a lump-sum to school districts on November 3rd based on verified historical allowance.
- Three-year-olds with IEPs are funded separately
 - Monthly payments based on enrollment
 - Information about reporting requirements will come in November






Project Overview

- Contracted with Early Milestones Colorado to facilitate the quality standards development process
- House Bill 22-1295 tasked the Colorado Department of Early Childhood (CDEC) with developing quality standards for Universal Preschool
- The Rules Advisory Council (RAC) is composed of a diverse, fifteen (15) member group that regularly meets to discuss proposed rules for consideration, advise the Executive Director of potential impacts related to those rules, and make a final recommendation for the CDEC Executive Director to consider before promulgating proposed rule(s)

Quality Standards Overview

Universal Preschool Quality Standard 1: Instructional Practice

 Instructional Practice (IP) is considered to be everything preschool providers 'do' with children. A well-balanced pedagogical approach or curriculum supports the development of the whole child and incorporates assessment.

Universal Preschool Quality Standard 2: Healthy Development

- Healthy Development (HD) ensures preschool providers support the healthy bodies and minds of children. Addressing children's development is a critical component of a whole child approach.
- Universal Preschool Quality Standard 3: Family & Community Engagement
 - Family and Community Engagement (FC) allows for affirmation of all aspects of children's identity and acknowledges families as their child's first caregiver and most important teacher.

- Any Universal Preschool provider who is active, signed the agreement, and has matches is eligible
- Funding categories:
 - Furniture, Educational Materials and Supplies, Health Care Materials and Supplies, Technology, Site Infrastructure, Quality Standards

Provider Bonus

- Attestation available in September
- Universal Preschool providers who have never done CPP, active, signed the agreement and have matches by 8/31/23
- \$800 One-time payment
