How to choose the right preschool.



How do you know where to begin?

Start by considering what you know about your child and where they will thrive. Denver Preschool Program partners with over 260 preschools across Denver and nearby communities, offering a wide range of options, including family childcare homes, center-based programs, and preschools within Denver Public Schools. All partner preschools are licensed and go through a thorough quality rating process. If your child is in their final year of preschool before kindergarten and lives in Denver, they are eligible for tuition support through DPP, and we will pay your provider directly on your behalf, reducing your monthly costs.

DPP Tuition Support can be combined with Colorado Universal Preschool (UPK) as long as your provider participates in both programs.

- 1 Use our online Find a Preschool tool at DPP.org to check out the location, description, hours of operation, contact information and quality rating of our preschool partners.
- 2 Schedule a visit with your child so you can see how your child feels in the preschool and how staff relates to your child.

 - Enroll your child in your top-choice preschools.
- **5** Get help with tuition.
